#### **PRIMARY SCHOOL**

In Primary, Ms Driver continues to lead and now both Ms Taylor and Ms Taggart as the Deputy Heads are out of the classroom and working to drive new initiatives and

raise standards in Primary. New interventions have been set up, assessment—and tracking are moving forward as well as as Professional development of staff. All these aspects support the Primary girls learning and really drive progress of our young learners. The phonics programme is making a real difference and primary girls are being monitored against UK standards.

#### SECONDARY SCHOOL

In the secondary department, we welcome two new members to the team who joins Ms J. Whay as part of the Secondary Leadership team. Ms.Hayward brings her wealth of experience and outstanding leadership background to our team as the new head of secondary, having previously served as Principal at an all-through boarding school in the UK and demonstrated excellence in various leadership positions within prestigious educational institutions. We also welcome Ms Sheridan, who serves as the Deputy Head of Academics. Several changes are underway in the secondary department, as evidenced by the recent Parents' meetings in January. Ms Hayward is currently implementing adjustments to programmes, ensuring accountability among staff and students, and enhancing standards across the board. Information meetings for parents are being organised, alongside individual meetings with teachers and leaders. We encourage all parents to engage with the team to positively influence their daughters' learning journeys. Additionally, Year 10 and Year 9 girls will undertake the CAT 4 assessment from the UK, providing us with a standardised benchmark of their current academic standing and predictions for IGCSE and AS levels. Our Year 12 students have been collaborating with Ms Sara, our new careers officer, and have submitted applications to Texas A&M, Northwestern, Carnegie Mellon, and QU.


Emphasising the significance of reading for academic achievement, we urge parents to consider when their daughters last engaged with a book. Watching TikTok or YouTube does not equate to reading; therefore, we encourage girls to immerse themselves in literature, expand their vocabulary, and cultivate their imagination. We kindly request the support of parents in fostering a culture of reading among our secondary students. As a reminder, it is essential for all secondary girls to bring a reading book to school daily.

#### **ARABIC DEPARTMENT**

The Arabic team's collaboration with the British Curriculum and introduction of phonics and reading programmes demonstrate their innovative approach to language instruction. By integrating phonics-based learning methods and incorporating reading activities throughout the curriculum, they are equipping students with essential language skills and fostering a lifelong love for learning. By organising field trips, cultural excursions, and outdoor learning activities, they are providing students with hands-on learning experiences that complement classroom instruction and enrich their overall learning journey.
